"There is a Balm in Gilead"

Text based on Jeremiah 8:22

African American Spiritual, arr. William L. Dawson

There is a Balm in Gilead, to make the wounded whole,

There is a Balm in Gilead, to heal the sin-sick soul. (Refrain repeats)

Sometimes I feel discouraged and think my work's in vain,

But then the Holy Spirit revives my soul again. (Refrain repeats)

If you cannot sing like angels, if you cannot preach like Paul,

You can tell the love of Jesus, and say, "He died for all." (Refrain repeats)

Historical Context – This anthem was chosen as part of a worship mini series to celebrate Black History Month, particularly the compositions of African American musicians throughout American history. The African American Spiritual "There is a Balm in Gilead" was written and composed anonymously on an unknown date. The author(s) and composer(s) are unknown because it was illegal at the time for enslaved people to learn to read and write.

The enslaved musician(s) who penned this spiritual were likely inspired by the writings of John Newton and Charles Wesley, two prominent ministers who loudly opposed slavery during the 18th and 19th centuries. John Newton formerly worked in the slave trade and famously wrote the lyrics to "Amazing Grace" after being convicted by the Holy Spirit that slavery was evil. Charles Wesley referred to the slave trade as "the execrable sum of all villainies." The text of this spiritual rings true in that only Christ can make our wounded souls truly whole – the Great Physician continuously heals humanity from all evil and sickness. This text also points out that the mission field is inclusive; every Christian can tell the world about the unending love of Jesus. Actions can speak that message loudly for those of us who struggle with written or spoken words.

CALL TO CONFESSION

Into the shadows of our isolation, God speaks the words of life and community. Through God's graceful, healing presence, God redeems our woundedness and restores us to wholeness. Trusting in God's gracious provision, let us together confess our limitations and proclaim God's faithfulness.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Generous God, we are baptized as your people, called to live and serve together as your church. We confess that we have sought to live for ourselves, not reaching out to others and honoring the divine image in all your children. Forgive us, we pray. In your abundant mercy give us the grace to be your church, confessing our faults, offering forgiveness and working for reconciliation. Turn our hearts to your intentions that we may hold fast to one another and draw near to your presence. In Jesus, we ask it. Amen.
