About the Anthem: O Waly Waly is a traditional English folk tune that likely originated as a love song in the early 1700s. Southern American composer Hal H. Hopson chose this tune in 1971 for his canticle setting of 1 Corinthians 13, "The Gift of Love." Beverly Easterling is a writer and voice teacher in Louisiana who is also a popular lyricist; she contributed to the 1982 Episcopal hymnal. Composer Mark Schweizer collaborated with Easterling for this two-part setting. Originally from Florida, Schweizer was well known in our area as the previous editor of the St. James Music Press in Tryon, North Carolina.
