

"The Strife is O'er"

Latin hymn, c. 1695 | Composer Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (1525-1594) Translator Francis Pott (1832-1909) | Adapted by William H. Monk (1823-1889)

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The strife is o'er, the battle done; the victory of life is won;

The song of triumph has begun. Alleluia!

The powers of death have done their worst, but Christ their legions hath dispersed:

Let shouts of holy joy outburst. Alleluia!

The three sad days are quickly sped; Christ rises glorious from the dead:

All glory to our risen Head! Alleluia!

Lord, by the stripes which wounded thee, from death's dread sting thy servants free,

That we may live, and sing to thee: Alleluia!

Alleluia, alleluia!

About this Hymn:

This tune was composed by one of the most famous sacred musicians of all time Giovanni Pierluiga da Palestrina (often named only as 'Palestrina' after his birthplace). He was born in the Papal States, was a choir member throughout his childhood, and then became an organist at 19. He went on to serve as choirmaster in various churches and composed hundreds of works including over a thousand masses and more than three hundred motets. His counterpoint is considered the inspiration for later Baroque forms (i.e. Bach's fugues), and he was even credited by some with saving church music from drudgery during a time period when flourishes, ornaments, and embellishments were considered excessive in the church. The Latin hymn text later set to this tune illustrates the trinity and expresses our highest praise through the threefold amens.

The arranger of the hymn version of this tune, William Henry Monk, was an English organist turned choir master. He also began his organ career during his teenage years; at age 24 he was appointed to lead the choir at King's College in London. He went on to serve as choirmaster at St. Matthias where he began daily choral worship services corresponding to the liturgical calendar. Monk is most famous for writing the lyrics and composing the tune for the hymn "Abide with Me" (EVENTIDE).
