"Christ is Made the Sure Foundation"

Text from 7 th century Latin | Translated by John Mason Neale (1818-1866)

Tune by Henry Thomas Smart (1813-1879)

Christ is made the sure foundation, Christ the head and cornerstone,
Chosen of the Lord and precious, Binding all the church in one;
Holy Zion's help forever, and our confidence alone.
To this temple, where we call You, come, O Lord of Hosts today;
With Your wonted lovingkindness hear Your people as they pray,
And Your fullest benediction shed within its walls alway.
Laud and honor to the Father, Laud and honor to the Son,
Laud and honor to the Spirit, ever three and ever one;
One in might and one in glory while unending ages run.

The text of this hymn was translated from Latin sacred poetry by John Mason Neale, D.D. As an Anglican priest, he was well known for directly serving the poor, homeless people, and the elderly. His translations were not considered particularly singable and were usually altered by publishers. It is particularly interesting that this was one of the first texts Neale translated, it was published in his first collection of Medieval Hymns and Sequences (1851). He claimed no rights to his texts or translations, considering hymnody the "common property of Christendom."

Henry T. Smart composed this tune for the Horatius Bonar 'Doxology' ("Glory Be to God the Father"). The tune was first published in 1867 in the English Presbyterian Church hymnal – for which Smart served as music editor. His colleague James Hamilton, the text editor, was the minister at Regent Square Church. Hamilton gave the tune its name REGENT SQUARE after his post, Henry Smart gave up a career in law to pursue music, despite being mostly a self-taught organist. He played for over twenty-five years and went on to design organs, including the ones at St. Andrew Hall in Glasgow, Scotland and the Town Hall of Leeds. Smart went completely blind at the age of 52, but he utilized his memory to continue playing the organ until his death at 65. While he left a treasure trove of compositions – an opera, oratorios, hymn tunes, instrumental music, choral pieces, and organ solo works. This hymn is his most popular work, by far.
