# About the Anthem:

Natalie Allyn Wakely Sleeth was originally from Evanston, Illinois. She began to study the piano at four years old and went on to earn a BA in music theory at Wellesley College. Natalie later married a Professor of Homiletics, The Reverend Ronald E. Sleeth. She composed an inauguration anthem entitled "Joy in the Morning" for her husband's inauguration as President of West Virginia Wesleyan College in 1977. Over a million copies of the anthem are in print. Other very popular compositions from Natalie Sleeth include "In the Bulb there is a Flower" (also called "Hymn of Promise") and "Were You There on That Christmas Night?" While Natalie sadly passed away at age 62 of cancer, her influence continues through her music. She is one of the most popular and prolific composers in our choral library.

This anthem talks about the extraordinary birth and life of Jesus, and how it is far too easy to forget the miracle of Christ coming to earth. Musically, it is very interesting because it uses both canon and countermelody between the two voice parts. The broken chords are accessible on the guitar as well as piano. Because Jesus was sent to earth, had a human birth, showed us the Way, and died to save us — we have eternal hope. Let us not be blinded by our humanity. This Advent season and always may our eyes remain open to the eternal hope and glory of Jesus Christ, Emmanuel — God with us.

# LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE "Hope"
